The residential trip ended with a Greek banquet and an exciting time was had by all!
























Year 4 - Science and ICT


They have also had some very exciting ICT days this half term, working with Mr Lynch on building and then programming some robots. They have been working collaboratively and have been recording their processes on an online journal.
