Year 1 Update

Children were both shocked and amazed this week when the tiger from The Tiger Who Came to Tea caused havoc in our classrooms (roarsome!). Children had to retell what the tiger got up to, with a focus on using verbs with the -ed suffix. Next week children will be planning and writing their own narrative based on the famous story.

Since half term we have been learning how to subtract in maths. We have learnt to subtract using crossing out, our number lines and part whole models. We have been challenging ourselves by doing the fact family. We have been super impressed with the children's accuracy when using these methods in partner and independent work.

Our first science lesson was all about seasonal change. The children observed and described the weather, animals and flowers associated with autumn. They also went outside and drew our autumnal tree. We will then repeat this activity each season to see the difference and to notice any changes. Year 1 loved spotting the colourful leaves and enjoyed predicting what would happen to the trees next season.


The children have also taken part in an exciting but messy eggs-periment to launch our new Science topic on Materials. They explored different materials such as wood, metal, plastic, wool, and foam. They then predicted which materials would make a suitable landing pad to prevent Humpty Dumpty from cracking after falling from the wall.

We have also started our first history unit in Year 1 this week, investigating the question 'How has life changed?'. Our children worked as historians to match events and objects to different stages of human life and sorted these on a timeline. Children particularly enjoyed looking at pictures of the Year 1 teachers throughout their lives so far and were surprised by how much they had changed since they were at school!
