Last Friday, we were delighted to welcome Karl Nova to Belleville to hold workshops with our Year 6 classes as part of their poetry topic.

Karl Nova is one of the UK's leading poets and Hip Hop artists who delivers his work in his own unique, witty and energetic style. His debut book "Rhythm And Poetry" won the CLiPPA Award for Children's Poetry in 2018 and is about being true to yourself, fostering a spirit of curiosity and following your dreams.

The children were completely engaged by his humorous and reflective workshops and inspired to write poetry. It was an inspirational visit that the children and their teachers will remember for a long time to come.

# **Reception Update**

As we head into the final week before half term, it seems hard to believe the Reception children have almost completed their first half term at Belleville! It has been amazing to see how quickly they have settled; the progress they have already made and the close friendships they have begun to build.

Over this half term, our focus has been on settling in, school routines, managing emotions and building positive relationships. As part of 'Our World' topic, we have loved hearing the children talk about their families and share family photographs.

In phonics, we have introduced most of the single letter sounds and begun writing words and captions. In maths, we have looked at different ways of sorting including by size, colour and function as well exploring repeating patterns. We love books and have read a range of fiction and non-fiction books linked in with our 'All About Me' topic.

In the afternoons, the learning is led by the children's interests with an array of activities set up for them to access. Whether that be making repeating patterns with musical instruments; drawing and painting their own self-portraits; taking selfies; reading in the book area or creating houses from different materials.





















# French Update

KS2 have made an excellent start with French this term! We have been learning key language to help us communicate in French in the classroom. Children are participating really well in singing, miming and partner talk. Native French speakers have been challenging themselves by finding synonyms for key words.

# **European Day of Languages**

Recently, all KS2 classes had a special French lesson to celebrate European Day of Languages. This celebration happens all over Europe every year on 26th September, to raise awareness of the many languages in the world.

We counted the different languages spoken in the class (around 18-25 in each class!), listened to a song from the Little Mermaid in 22 languages and played an escape game to quiz our knowledge of different languages.

Children were very enthusiastic to share the languages they speak at home and so respectful towards others and their different languages.

# **Parking on Zig Zag Lines**
