Open Classrooms

Following the success of our first Open Classroom event last year, we are excited to announce that we will be running two more Open Classroom events this academic year. The first will be at the start of Spring Term. Please see dates below:

We look forward to opening our doors so that your child can share their learning with you in their classrooms. This is a fantastic opportunity for you to look through some of your child's work with them and to celebrate their achievements from Autumn term. Please note, this is not a time for a catch-up with the class teacher as there will be a parents'/carers' evening later in the Spring term.

On the day of the events, our gates will open at 2:40pm and you will be directed to your child's classroom. After 30 minutes, your child's teacher will ask you to leave so that the children can pack away and get ready for going home. Dismissal will remain at the same time, and you will collect your child from their usual place in the playground.

To accommodate more parents' busy schedules, our Open Classroom event in the Summer term will take place at the start of the school day, straight after drop-off - more details will follow later in the year. We understand that many parents/carers may not be able to attend due to other commitments. To avoid disappointment, please can you let your child know in advance if you are unable to attend.

School Council Visit to the Houses of Parliament

Members of the School Council went to visit the Houses of Parliament to understand more about the House of Lords and the House of Commons. They walked around the different buildings and had a workshop to understand what Parliament does. They were able to have debates and ask lots of questions. "I learnt that the colour is green in the House of Commons and that they hold meetings there, but they do not have a gold throne like in the House of Lords. Reception Update

It has been a busy few weeks in Reception and the children have really loved this half term's focus on light and dark. This has involved learning about night and day, shadows, nocturnal and diurnal animals, and the solar system. The children have also created some wonderful art pieces focussing on colour mixing and inspired by the work of Kandinsky and Rothko.

We have now covered all the single letter sounds and some digraphs and the children continue to practise using these to write words, captions, and sentences. In maths, we have focused on numbers to 10 including reciting, writing and ordering them, as well as looking at number bonds to 5. 2D shapes have been introduced and we have encouraged children to talk about the different shapes and their properties.

Over the past few weeks, we have been gearing up for our Nativity plays ready for this week's performances, which we hope you all really enjoyed. In the classroom, much of our learning has taken a Christmassy turn with letters to Santa and Christmas artwork, as well as learning about why and how we celebrate Christmas.
