

Eco-Council Update

On Monday, the eco-councillors went on a trip to the Wandsworth recycling centre to learn more about what happens to our rubbish and recycling when we dispose of it at school. The eco-councillors were intrigued by the amount of rubbish arriving at the centre during our visit. We were taught how the recycling is separated into the different materials and how they organise it to be recycled again.

Our tour guide Debra reminded the children on some key take home messages including not to put tissues in the recycling as these cannot be recycled due to contamination and to dispose of batteries correctly as these can cause small fires when they are compressed in bins or lorries. All the children were motivated to come back to school to ensure our school is recycling as much as possible and to spread the message of the 3Rs (reduce, reuse, and recycle).













Year 3 Roman Day

Last Friday, Year 3 was invaded by the Roman Army! The children and teachers had a fantastic day to launch our new history topic 'Why did the Romans invade Britain?' They took part in five different activities, each one run by a different Year 3 teacher.

The activities included a Roman feast, wax tablet making, learning Roman numerals, mosaic making and learning to march like the Roman army. The children's enthusiasm for everything was outstanding and it brought a lot of excitement for the topic ahead.
