Year 6 Update

Year 6 have continued their excellent work this half term and have enjoyed several enrichment opportunities.

Just before the half term break, we descended upon The Old Vic Theatre to watch Kwame Alexander perform. His resilience of character and poetic writing inspired the children to write and perform their own poems about 'Peer Pressure' in a poetry slam event.

Since then, Transport for London have come in to speak to the children about using public transport safely and the children were encouraged to get a Zip card, which enables them to travel for free on buses and trams.

Last week, the children enjoyed a presentation by Carol Rahm, a local historian, who spoke to us about what Battersea was like during World War 2. The children were shown how the damage caused in the war has shaped Battersea today.

Aside from these exciting enrichment opportunities, the children have continued their hard work in the classroom. A notable highlight is that we have started reading 'The Longest Night of Charlie Noon', a tense novel set during World War 2. We are constantly in suspense as Christopher Edge, the author, drops in subtle clues as to how the plot with develop, leaving us on a cliff hanger at the end of each chapter.




Christmas tree sale - Saturday 30 November, 8.30am – 11am, Webb's Road. Collect your pre-ordered Christmas tree or choose one on the day.
