ICT


In this half term, the classes have covered a range of different topics in Computing and Digital Literacy. Year 1 have been learning how to program the Bee-Bot Robots in fun practical activities using floor mats. They are developing an understanding of how to put together a basic sequence of instructions to solve problems and thereby begin to understand what an algorithm is. We also encourage the children to correct mistakes and understand the need to debug simple programs.

In Year 2 we have been learning how to search for information using the internet. We have found pictures of "Life Changers" linked to our History topic. We know how to use keywords and have saved and added our pictures of historical characters to our own files in Photos on the iPad. We have begun to format information in our own non-fiction books using The BookCreator App on our iPads.



Year 3 have been exploring the Scratch App to plan create and debug simple programs. We've begun to make animations and create story sequences. Year 4 have been using the Keynote App on the iPads to plan, research and present to share ideas to the class.

Year 5 are exploring the digital artwork of David Hockney using the drawing App he uses. We have produced our own versions of his floral still life works and sketches of Yosemite park. Year 6 are using the Lego EV3 Robots to design, write and debug programs to solve practical driving challenges.





Year 1

In maths we have been focusing on numbers to 40. The children have been using dienes to help solidify their understanding of place value. They have begun comparing numbers to find which one is greater by looking first at the tens and then the ones.

In ICT, the children have been using programmable floor robots called Bee-Bots in our computing lessons. They entered instructions to make the Bee-Bots spell words. The children were buzzing when they were able to programme the Bee-Bots correctly.

For our RE topic on Christianity, children visited our local church. The aim of the trip was to explore the different features of a church and find out more about what Christians believe. The children were praised by the vicar for their observant and thoughtful questions.



Our Year 1 science unit this half term is all about how long our rubbish lasts. The children have been learning about what happens to rubbish after it gets thrown into the bin. They were amazed to learn how long it takes for different materials to decompose. They have really enjoyed observing how food decomposes over time - this apple core and peelings have been decomposing for 4 weeks now!
