Year 6 Visit the BFI IMAX

On Tuesday, Year 6 went on a trip to the BFI IMAX in Waterloo as part of their Second World War and Migration topics in history and geography. This interactive event included feature film clips and films from the BFI National Archive which showed wartime life on the Home Front. The films covered subjects including the Blitz, 'digging for victory', rationing, evacuation, Windrush and the impacts of the Second World War. The event concluded with a screening of Good Night Mr Tom, a moving story about an evacuee during the Blitz.

When we arrived for our workshop and screening, the excitement at the sheer scale of the screen was palpable. The children were treated to a viewing of several government information and propaganda films, reflecting on matters such as audience, purpose, atmosphere and mood. They had plenty of opportunity to demonstrate their learning about the Second World War. At the end of the workshop, the children wrote a 'Dig for Victory' advertisement, with several Belleville children brave enough to share their excellent efforts with an audience of over 200 people. Thanks go to our adult helpers and the children for their excellent behaviour when representing the school in public.
