School Streets

Meteor Site

Wandsworth Council is launching the trial phase of a School Street on Meteor Street on Monday 14

October 2024. The School Street will operate from Monday to Friday, 8.20am – 9.10am and 3pm to

3.40pm, term time only. The road will be closed to all traffic during those times except to residents of the street, emergency vehicles and healthcare workers, and Blue Badge holders.

As with the Webb's Road School Street trial, the school needs to provide volunteers to staff the barriers during the hours of operation for the trial period. We would be very grateful for any support that you can give as we realise it is a much smaller group or parents/carers at this site. If you can support this project by staffing the barriers for even one session, please sign up here.

Brief training for volunteers will take place at the Meteor Site on **Thursday 10 October at school pick up time. 


Local Sport Opportunities

Reception

It has been wonderful to see how quickly all the children have settled in, the progress they have already made, and the strong friendships they have started to form.

This half term, we have focused on helping the children adjust to school life, learning routines, managing emotions, and building positive relationships. As part of our 'Our World' topic, we have enjoyed hearing the children share stories about their families and show family photos.

In phonics, we have introduced most of the single letter sounds, and the children have started writing words and short captions. In maths, we have explored sorting objects by size, colour, and function, as well as creating repeating patterns. We have read a variety of fiction and non-fiction books as part of our 'All About Me' topic.

Afternoons have been dedicated to child-led learning, with activities based on their interests. Whether it is drawing self-portraits, reading in the book corner, or building a train track, the children have had plenty of creative opportunities to explore and express themselves.









Year 2 - Science Trip

As part of their Science unit, Year 2 have been to Morden Hall Park on an exciting trip this week, run by The National Trust. They explored a variety of habitats found within the park and found out why certain land invertebrates live there, as well as having a go at pond dipping.
