Reception Update

It seems hard to believe we are already heading towards the end of our first full term at Belleville. It has been wonderful to see how quickly all the children have settled in; the friendships they have built and the progress they have made with their learning.

It has been a busy few weeks and the children have really loved this half term's focus on light and dark. This has involved learning about night and day; shadows; nocturnal and diurnal animals and the solar system. The children have also created some wonderful art pieces focussing on colour mixing, inspired by the work of Kandinsky and Rothko.



We have now covered all the single letter sounds and some digraphs. We incorporate daily practice, using these in words, captions and sentences. In maths, we have focused on numbers to 10 - reciting, writing and ordering them as well as looking at number bonds to 5. 2D shapes have been introduced through naming them and describing their properties.



As we head into the final couple of weeks, we are very excited to be welcoming you to our Christmas performances next week. We will also have a huge array of fun Christmas activities for the children, including letter writing to Santa; lots of Christmas arts and crafts and learning why and how people celebrate Christmas.

Art Update

Every year group began this year by practicing their drawing skills. Year 1 were inspired by the artist Paul Klee's painting 'Fish Magic'. The children carefully observed the shapes, lines and textures on different fish and then used the wax resist and sgraffito techniques to create these beautiful colourful fish artworks.



Year 2 have been drawing from their imagination, inspired by the artist, Joan Miró. They made playful drawings on acetate which they then laid on top of different watercolour and collage backgrounds to see how they changed the mood of their drawing.

Year 3 have been experimenting with different drawing materials when carefully observing natural forms inspired by Georgia O'Keeffe. They used charcoal to draw shells and oil pastels to make colour studies of flowers.

Year 4 have made beautiful drawings of birds. They have focussed on texture, shading and value to create these detailed pencil drawings.

Year 5 have made these amazing shoe drawings after learning about the artist Chiharu Shiota, who uses objects like shoes in her installation artworks. They learnt more about proportion, texture, value and shading. They are now enjoying making these designs with clay. They have been exploring textures and adding exciting details to their shoes before they go on to add colour.



Year 6 were inspired by the artist, Peter Randall-Page when they made these impressive pencil drawings of natural forms. They learnt about the symmetry and geometry found in nature and how it informs this artist's drawings, prints and sculptures.


