# **Year 6 Update**

This week has seen Year 6 taking part in 1940s day. From dressing up in 1940s style outfits to experiencing the drama and tension created by an air raid siren, Year 6 have been able to live as a child during 1940s London. They have cracked codes, endured rigorous handwriting practice, listened to Glenn Miller, made 'austerity decorations' and a range of other activities that helped them to build some understanding of life in wartime.

This has been a perfect opportunity to combine our writing and history units this half-term, both of which are looking to develop understanding of the Second World War experience. By reading the adventures of a group of friends in Christopher Edge's fantastic 'The Longest Night of Charlie Noon', children are given an insight into Dunkirk, the Blitz, the Enigma devices and Bletchley Park. In history, listening to a talk from Carol Rahn with first hand experiences of people from Wandsworth who were in the war, either in the city or as evacuees, has helped to enrich the children's perspectives on those involved in different ways.

#### Year 5 and 6 French Bee

Year 5 and 6 pupils have the exciting opportunity to participate in the national <u>Routes Into Languages</u> <u>Primary Bee</u>. The first stage of the competition will take place within school next week, but later stages will happen externally against other schools. Winners from Belleville will qualify for the next stage.

The aim of the Primary Bee is for pupils in Years 5 & 6 to practise and improve their vocabulary, pronunciation, and memory skills in French. All pupils will learn the words in class and at home, but participation in the competition is optional. Native or bilingual pupils are not eligible to compete.

Pupils will be given 40 words or phrases to learn at each stage. During the competition, pupils will be given the word or phrase in English, and they will have to translate it correctly into French ensuring accurate pronunciation and intonation.
