Music Update

Years 1 to 3 have been exploring pitch this half term. Year 1 has been learning to sing and play songs on xylophones using do-re-mi-fa-sol-la-ti-do in C major, using step, leap, jump and slide patterns. Year 2 has been learning songs using five pitches on the ocarinas and have been working hard on improving their finger co-ordination and reading rhythms in 3/4 time. They have also been learning to sing rounds with class leaders to help them. Year 3 has been exploring pitches BAGC on the recorder and learning how to read them on stave.

Year 6 have started their singing project, delivered by the Wandsworth Music vocal team, and are having a great time learning a disco lives medley and songs by Emelie Sandi, Adele, and Rick Ashley in 2- and 3-part harmonies. They cannot wait to start singing some Abba after half term. We look forward to both their in-school and Fairfield Halls performances at the end of the term.

The orchestra performed a marvellous rendition of James Bond for the Mayor's Gala Concert on Tuesday evening at the Civic Centre - it was quite a challenging song for a primary school to learn and the orchestra practiced, worked hard, and sounded fantastic - well done orchestra!

Nursery Update

Nursery excitement reached scorching temperatures a couple of weeks ago, as both classes visited Battersea Fire Station to enrich their topic of Fire fighters. The trip began instantly with the children's first experience of riding in the school minibus. Once at the station, they learned about the number to call for an emergency, sat in the front seat of one of the fire engines and some even tried on a real fire fighter's helmet. The children were able to fire a water hose and learned about how a fire fighter's special uniform keeps them safe. It was such an exciting visit for all where the Blue Watch team made the young firefighter enthusiasts feel very welcome.













The Nursery children were also very lucky this week as we had guest speakers to talk about Chinese New Year or Lunar New Year, which will be taking place over the half term holiday. The children listened to a story about the Big Race and found out that 2024 is the Year of the Dragon. Children explored using chopsticks and noodles and were lucky enough to take home some chocolate money in Hong Bao envelopes.

Wandsworth Music - Applications for Music Scholarships

Applications for Music Scholarships to attend the Wandsworth Music Academy are open. Wandsworth Music, in partnership with the London Music Fund and the Thomas's Foundation, provide scholarships for children in Years 3 to 6 in challenging circumstances or in need of financial support to continue their music tuition.

Parents/carers must submit applications online at www.wandsworthmusic.co.uk/scholarships. The deadline for applications is **Tuesday 30 April 2024** for scholarships commencing in September. Students who are shortlisted will be informed in early June and may be invited to audition where they will need to perform a short piece of their choice.

The scholarships provide up to 4 years' of funding towards children attending the Wandsworth Music Academy including weekly instrumental tuition, instrument hire and ensemble membership, and can be worth up to the value of £4,000 for the funding period.
