What is Black History Month?

October is Black History Month in the UK, an event that has been celebrated nationwide for more than 30 years. The month was originally founded to recognise the contributions that people of African and Caribbean backgrounds have made to the UK over many generations. Now, Black History Month has expanded to include the history of not just African and Caribbean people but black people in general.

We share the belief that it is important to recognise the people who may have been forgotten and how they have helped to shape the UK and the world as well as the contemporary people who are currently making a difference.

What is happening in school?

We are continuing to work on our curriculum, taught throughout the year, to ensure it is representative of our children, their families and the richly diverse local and global community in which they live.

To add to this during Black History Month we will spend time in classes looking at 10 people in 10 days. We will discuss 3 main questions: Who are they? What they have done? Why they are significant?

By the end of this half term the children should be able to share up to 30 facts about the 10 people they have looked at. The school is alive with the sound of music!



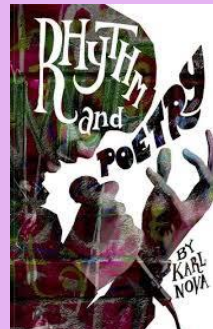
