Covid Health Advice

There is no longer a legal requirement for people with COVID-19 infection to self-isolate, however if your child(ren) have any of the main symptoms of COVID-19 or a positive test result, the public health advice is for them to stay at home and avoid contact with other people.

The main symptoms are a recent onset of a new continuous cough, high temperature or loss of/change in sense of smell or taste. If your child has any of these symptoms, you should get a PCR test. You are advised to keep them at home and avoid contact with other people whilst waiting for the test result.

Other symptoms linked with COVID-19 include shortness of breath, fatigue, loss of appetite, muscle ache, sore throat, headache, stuffy or runny nose, diarrhoea, nausea and vomiting. Any of these symptoms may also have another cause. Remember – if your child is unwell, for any reason, they should not come to school until they recover.

It is still advised that your child self-isolates for 10 days if they have COVID-19. You may choose to give them a Lateral Flow Device test from 5 days after the symptoms started (or the day the test was taken if they did not have symptoms), followed by another test the next day. If both these test results are negative, and your child does not have a high temperature, the risk that they are still infectious is much lower and they can safely return to their normal routine.

The full guidance is linked **HERE**. When there are outbreaks in school, we consult with the health agencies who may give additional specific advice on further measures to put in place. We will inform you as and when this happens.

Year 6 Join a Lunchtime Lecture

On Tuesday, some of our Year 6 children chose to join a transatlantic Zoom over their lunch break with National Ambassador for Children's Literature, Jason Reynolds. Children have studied 'Ghost' in Year 6 for the past two years and it is always greeted with enthusiasm: other stories in the 'Track' series and his recent graphic novel collaboration 'Stuntboy in the Meantime' are now class library favourites. Several Belleville children had their questions answered by the superstar writer who frequently appears on US television speaking about his writing. We learned that most of his back catalogue has been optioned for film or television: excitingly, the 'Track' series (of which 'Ghost' is part) is being adapted for Apple TV. Reynolds also spoke of connecting with young people through books, the influence of hip-hop on his writing and his admiration for Walter Dean Myers (whose name some children may recognise as he is referenced heavily in Sharon Creech's 'Love That Dog', a Year 6 Guided Reading favourite). Reynolds has also written several books for young adults, so hopefully, many of our children will continue to enjoy his books beyond their time at Belleville.
