#### Reminders of current Self-Isolation Guidance

#### Your child must self-isolate when:

- they get a positive lateral flow test result at home (you do not need to get a PCR test to confirm this)
- they have symptoms (however mild) and:
  - o get a PCR test
  - o self-isolate until you get the results of the PCR test

If a lateral flow test or PCR test is positive, the rest of the household should also get a PCR test. The rest of the household do not need to self- isolate whilst you wait for the results unless you are an unvaccinated adult.

# Guidance on the self-isolation period for anyone who has tested positive for Covid-19:

An individual now has the option to reduce their self-isolation period after 5 full days. This can only be done if the individual tests negative with a Lateral flow device (LFD) on both Day 5 and Day 6 and if they do not have a temperature. If the result of either of their tests is positive, they should continue to self-isolate until they get negative results from two LFD tests on consecutive days <u>or</u> until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest.
