



New Teacher training to Masters Level

Belleville Teaching School is offering a two year programme combining NQT and RQT training with St Mary's masters modules to give applicants pedagogical theory and skills based training. At the end of the 2 years the participants will leave with an MA in education: Pedagogy.

In the first year the participants will receive:

- 10 half day skills based training sessions provided by Belleville Teaching School
- 6 – 10 half day MA level sessions provided by St Marys University

In the second year the participants will receive:

- 4 half day skills based training sessions provided by Belleville Teaching School
- 4 half day MA level training sessions provided by St Marys University
- Other additional twilight and weekend training provided by St Marys and or/ blended and online training to suit the needs of the learner.

Costs:

£550 for 14 ½ day sessions provided by Belleville over 2 years

£1040 per 30 credits for MA level training provided by St Mary's over 2 years. To be paid by school or applicant depending on arrangement. In total £6489.600 for 180 credits.
