<u>Concerts</u>

- Nursery: Classes will be singing some Christmas songs for parents/carers at their concerts.
- Reception: Each class will be putting on a nativity style performance, which will take place in school in the hall.
- Years 1 and Year 2: There will be a nativity performance for each year group, which will be around the Christmas story and will be performed in St Michael's church.
- Years 3, 4, 5 and 6: There will be a concert on the theme of 'Peace', which will be performed in St Michael's church. The songs are being practised in music lessons; they are around this theme and do not have any religious content.

If you would rather your child does not participate in the concert preparations and/or the concerts themselves, we ask that you send in a note to the class teacher to this effect. Where there are songs being taught which are of a Christmas theme or rehearsals are taking place, alternative arrangements will be made for your child.

Christmas lunch

This will be on Tuesday December 18th.

Children will have the choice of a traditional Christmas lunch and there will be crackers, hats and decorated halls. Father Christmas visits the children over the lunch.
