



The process

- September and October visit schools
- September 19th Wandsworth test (VR + NVR)
- Week commencing 14th October test result outcomes to allow a more informed decision
- Submit one form by 31st October for <u>any</u> London state school
- March school offers
- Appeal process

Collecting information

- 'Choose a Wandsworth Secondary School'
- Websites
- Contact schools for prospectus
- Admission criteria (distance of offers)
- Number of places vs number of applications
- Curriculum aims/ethos
- Activities
- Ofsted/performance tables
- Distance/travel costs
- Talk to your child (different)
- Don't believe what others say
- Visit as many schools as you can (open days)

Application Process

- Complete one form from home borough
- Apply for up to 6 schools in any borough
- Rank the schools in order of preference
- Applications are passed between boroughs

Permanent address on 31st October 2019

- Where parents share custody, one address given and need to prove residency at this address
- Change address after submitting the form (31st
 October) and before 12th December notify pupil services with proof, this new address will be used
- New address after 12th December not used as to allocate place (used for correspondence)
- Council have become stricter on temporary relocations – evidence required of permanent address.


If the number of applications are greater than places available:

Schools follow admission criteria

- Special need (EHCP) and children in care
- Siblings (on roll)
- Exceptional medical/social need
- Children of staff
- Distance to school (straight line measure)
- Religious commitments
- Feeder primary schools (Bolingbroke only)

Types of places

- Non-selective (Ark Putney, Bolingbroke, Burntwood, Ernest Bevin, Graveney, Harris Battersea, St. Cecilia's, Sir John Bosco, Southfields)
- Banding (Ashcroft, Chestnut Grove)



- Selective (Burntwood, Ernest Bevin, Graveney)
- Specialist (Ashcroft technology; St Cecilia's music; Chestnut Grove - art and design + languages)

Selective places

- -Burntwood (girls) (78 selective, 235 non-selective)
- -Graveney (mixed) (70 selective, 210 non-selective)
- -Ernest Bevin (boys) (60 selective, 120 non-selective)
- Places reserved for children who receive highest Wandsworth Test score
- Children only need to get a very high score in the Wandsworth Tests if they are going for one of these selective places and would not get in otherwise
- Graveney needed 256+ (2019)
- Burntwood needed 209+ (2019)
- Ernest Bevin needed 202+ (2019)

Specialist Places

- Ashcroft Technology Academy SIF deadline 13th September (tomorrow)
- Offers 24 places to the highest scores in a technological aptitude test
- St. Cecilia's SIF deadline 13th September (tomorrow)
- Offers 15 specialist places in Music
- Chestnut Grove (Art + Design and MFL) has assessments in September

Faith schools

If you are considering applying for a school place on faith grounds, it is important you complete the school's **Supplementary Information Form (SIF)**





Filling out the form

- Apply for up to 6 schools

- Each school considers application separately school is not aware of their position on your form
- Schools inform borough if a place can be allocated for your child
- If more than one school offers a place, borough offers highest school on form
- Pupils automatically remain on the waiting list for each unsuccessful school application.

- If you are unsuccessful with your listed schools, your borough will allocate the school closest still with available places

When Offers are Made

You can:

- a. Accept the place by returning the reply slip (if you decide to reject the place it may not be re-offered)
- **b. Find out more** about why your child was not offered a particular place and their position on the waiting list by calling pupil services
- c. Your child can stay on the **waiting list** for a higher preference but may not be offered this place. Places on the waiting list are held until September 2020.
- d. Decide to **appeal** the deadline for this will be included in the letter
- e. Make a late application to schools not on your original list or lower placed than offer

Online application

- Secure and confidential
- Save your form and log back in later to finish or make changes
- Receive email reminders to submit form and results
- 95% of parents applied online last year

Independent schools

- School arrangements, admissions and procedures vary from school to school
- Apply directly to each school check websites/ phone/ request prospectus
- Scholarships available for particular subjects and / or general ability
- Bursaries available for families within a certain income bracket
- More subjective process interviews (even parents), references, school reports, auditions are used to decide places
